2025 Campground Information Pack

To avoid disappointment and to ensure fans are fully prepared for this year's event, fans intending on camping at Phillip Island should be aware that:

- All campsites must be pre-booked prior to arrival there will be NO ability to purchase campsites once you've arrived at the Circuit.
- Campsites are sold per site with an additional per person fee for each camper staying on the site.
- Each camper will be sent a wristband prior to the event Pease note: **NO ACCESS** to campgrounds will be granted without a wristband. Additional wristbands can be purchased (excluding Pre-Pitched and Glamping) if required, however all campers will need to fit within the site limits purchased.
- All campsites are either pre-selected or allocated there is **no need to line up in advance to secure** a **site.**
- Campers were given the option to pre-select their specific campsite in all campgrounds Highside North, Highside South and Trackside with the **exception** of Pre-Pitched and Glamping Sites which are allocated to the customer post purchase.

Please ensure fans take note of site sizes as they will be unable to utilise any space outside of their purchased site.



Please note that linen, eskie and table & chairs add ons are for Pre-Pitched campers only.

All requested amendments to bookings are subject to availability.

Please also note campground bookings <u>do not</u> grant fans access to the Circuit, and a valid ticket to the event is also required to enter the Circuit.

Campground FAQs

What size are the Campground sites?

Campground sites vary in size depending on the type of site purchased.

Trackside:

- Powered Sites = 4m x 9m
- Premium View Sites = 4m x 9m
- Premium Partial View Sites = 6m x 6m
- Pre-Pitched = 4m x 4m
- Standard Sites = 6m x 6m

Highside North:

- Powered Sites = 10m x 7m
- Standard Sites = 8m x 8m
- Pre-Pitched Sites = 8m x 8m
- Caravan Sites = 12m x 5m
- Glamping Sites = 5m Bell Tent

Highside South:

- Pre-Pitched Sites = 4m x 4m
- Caravan Sites = 7m x 14m (angled sites)

Pre-Pitched tent size:

Single: 3m x 3.6mTwin: 3m x 3.6mTriple: 3.6m x 3.6m

- Quad: 6.2m x 3.6m (Trackside only)

Do children camp free?

Yes, children 14 years and under can camp and are free of charge (excluding Pre-Pitched and Glamping). Children still require a wristband to be worn at all times. Child wristbands are not mailed out and can be collected from the Campground Ticket Office upon arrival at the circuit.

For every one (1) paying adult, you can redeem up to four (4) free children 14 years and under.

How many vehicles can I park in my site?

One vehicle and/or motorcycle/s per Campsite (excluding Trackside Pre-Pitched), provided that they fit within the designated Campsite boundary. However, overflow parking is available, and additional vehicle access must be purchased online at an additional cost of \$20 per vehicle.

Trackside Pre-Pitched: One parking pass has been allocated per Pre-Pitched Tent. Only motorcycles are permitted to park in the Pre-Pitched Trackside Campground. All other vehicles will have a 30 minute unload/load period and will then be directed to park in the nearby Campground Car Park. Should you have more than one vehicle/motorcycle per group and are yet to purchase your additional vehicle passes - please contact us prior to your arrival for additional parking options.



When are the Campgrounds open?

Campgrounds will open at 12pm Thursday 16th October 2025 for patrons to begin arriving and setting up their campsite for the event.

Can I arrive and queue onsite prior to Thursday?

No queuing or camping is allowed on site prior to Thursday. With our per site allocation system the site you have purchased is guaranteed. You may arrive anytime from 6am on Thursday morning in preparation for the Campgrounds to be opened at 12pm.

What time do I need to exit the Campgrounds?

All campers must exit the campgrounds by 12pm Monday 20th October 2025.

Where is the Campground Ticketing Office?

The Campground Ticketing Office is located in the Visitor Centre Car Park and will be open from Thursday to Sunday to assist you with any ticketing and access questions you have. Opening times are listed below.

For queries relating to the campgrounds, please visit our Campground Customer Service Offices located onsite in Highside South and Trackside. These are open 24 hours from 9am on Thursday, to 12pm on Monday.



Does the cost of camping include my entry into the event?

No, tickets to enter the event must also be purchased separately.

Can I purchase a Campsite at the event once I have arrived?

No, all campsites must be purchased prior to arriving at the Circuit. Patrons will not be able to purchase at the Campground Office upon arrival.

Can we have a campfire?

Yes, you are permitted to have a campfire in all campgrounds unless a Total Fire Ban Day has been declared in the Central Fire District. Please note the below conditions:

- campfires must only be lit in either a container that properly contains the fire or in a trench that is no greater than 30cm deep. The size of the fire will not exceed 1 metre in diameter;
- all campfires must be kept at a reasonable and manageable size, and the ground and airspace within 3 metres of the fire must be clear;
- an adult (over the age of eighteen years) must be in attendance at all times whilst the campfire (or the barbeque) is alight;
- fires are not to be lit inside Tents or other structures; and
- naked flames such as candles are not permitted within Tents or other structures.

Is BYO alcohol permitted?

No, BYO Alcohol is not permitted. BYO Alcohol will be confiscated and disposed of. Confiscated items will not be returned to the Patron and AGPC takes no responsibility for confiscated items.

Alcohol may be purchased at the venue.

Is glass permitted?

No, glass is not permitted to be brought into the event (except glass jars containing 300g or under of vegemite, jams or food preservatives).

Can I BYO food?

Yes, you can BYO food. Food outlets will also be positioned in both Trackside and Highside Campgrounds for patrons to purchase hot food and cold drinks.

The Champions Café at the Visitor Centre will also be opened for campers to purchase food and beverages. Access to the Visitor Centre will be via the main gate from the circuit (during event hours). When the circuit is closed, access will be available from the Trackside Campground.

Can I bring my BBQ or any other cooking apparatus?

You can bring your own BBQ or cooking apparatus however, please note the below conditions of use:

- a. campfires must only be lit in either a container that properly contains the fire or in a trench that is no greater than cm deep. The size of the fire will not exceed 1 metre in diameter;
- b. all campfires must be kept at a reasonable and manageable size, and the ground and airspace within 3 metres of the fire must be clear;
- c. an adult (over the age of eighteen years) must be in attendance at all times whilst the barbeque or campfire is alight;
- d. fires are not to be lit inside Tents or other structures; and
- e. naked flames such as candles are not permitted within Tents or other structures.

Can I bring a generator?

Campers can bring their own generators however subject to the below conditions:

- a. generators must not be operational between 10:00pm and 7:00am on any day;
- b. an adult (over the age of 18 years) must be in attendance at all times when a generator is being run;
- c. for each generator brought into the Camping Grounds by a Patron, that Patron must have at least 1 fire extinguisher;
- d. generators must not have a capacity greater than 5 KvA output;
- e. fuel for generators must be safely stored within a suitable sealed container, and not stored within a Tent. Refuelling is only permitted when the generator is turned off;
- f. the maximum amount of fuel permitted to be brought into the Camping Ground, in addition to the tank on the generator itself is not to exceed 20 litres per generator; and
- g. the ground and airspace within 500 millimetres of the generator must be clear.

Can I bring a gas bottle?

Gas bottles for personal cooking use are permitted in the Camping Grounds, subject to the following:

- a. Gas bottles must be free of rust and corrosion and must not contain any dents or other damage; and
- b. Gas bottles must be stamped in accordance with all relevant laws or regulations as evidence that they have been safety checked in the past 10 years.

What items are prohibited?

The following items are prohibited and will not be permitted in the campgrounds:

- Any unregistered vehicles (minibikes, electric scooters etc)
- Any bicycles
- Any alcoholic beverages not purchased within the venue
- Any glass (excluding sunglasses, binoculars and prescription glasses)
- Any animals (other than a guide dog)
- Any weapons
- Any electronic devices which may interfere with communications or broadcasting signals
- Any advertising banner, sign, poster or any promotional material marked on a tent
- Any fireworks or flares
- Any out of date/in poor condition gas bottles/leads. (Campground management reserves the right to inspect all gas bottles/leads and condemn any which in its opinion may be of poor condition).
- Drones
 - Confiscated items will be disposed of and will not be returned to the Patron. AGPC takes no responsibility for confiscated items.

What facilities are provided at the Campgrounds?

The facilities at the Campground include toilets, showers, food and beverage stalls, shelter, entertainment and marquees.



What accessible amenities are available?

There are accessible amenities in Highside North campgrounds including toilets and a shower. An accessible toilet only is available in Highside South and Trackside campgrounds.

An accessible shuttle bus service operates to and from the circuit from the campgrounds.

The campgrounds are largely grass paddocks that can become difficult to traverse if wet and muddy. Select sites such as the outer rim of the Highside North Powered sites are most easily accessible as the site is adjacent to a path.

Accessible circuit shuttle bus

A free wheelchair-accessible vehicle operates within the circuit. This vehicle is available for patrons with limited mobility and can transport up to four people including one wheelchair passenger. There is a path around the entire circuit for getting to and from each grandstand or viewing area. Check the Circuit Map for the closest gates, accessible shuttle stops and pathways to the areas you want to visit.

This is an on-call service only and priority will be given to patrons who pre-book. Bookings can be made by calling Wheelaway on 1800 133 320.

What happens in bad weather?

Please bring appropriate wet weather gear/attire. In severe weather conditions, your site may be relocated for your safety and experience at event. Refunds are not granted if your site is required to be relocated due to safety or wet weather.

Are pets allowed?

No, all campgrounds do not permit the entry of pets.

All certified guide, hearing, assistance and trainee support dogs are welcome. Please ensure your dog is easily identifiable as an assistance dog and that you can present relevant certification information upon request.

Can I bring my unregistered bike/vehicle into the event?

No, all vehicles at the event must have relevant and valid registration to be brought into the campgrounds.

Can I bring furniture?

Excessive furniture that blocks or impedes the view of other patrons is not permitted.

Can I reserve areas around the track by sectioning/cordoning off areas to prevent others entering?


No, cordoning off areas outside of your allocated camping spot is strictly prohibited and may result in your removal from the campgrounds.




